Please check tasks that interest you.

Docent (tour guide): Interact with visitors and relate the history of David Bradford, the House and its furnishings, and the Whiskey Rebellion. Training required; period attire will be provided.

Special Events: Set up and take down tents, chairs, decorations, materials, etc.

Whiskey Rebellion Festival: Staff information booths, help with set up/tear down and other tasks.

Demonstrator: For the festival, heritage days, and other special events, we often need those who can demonstrate a craft or skill of the late 18th Century. Period attire is encouraged but not required and can be provided.

Museum Aide: Prepare mailers, make copies, and other office chores.

Gardener: Help with the maintenance of the garden and grounds, with some knowledge of plants of the time period.

Who are we?

The Bradford House Museum is owned and operated by the Bradford House Historical Association.

Our history:

- The house has been a museum since 1965, after restoration.
- David Bradford built this house in 1788, the first stone, 2 story house in Washington. By 18th century frontier standards, it was a mansion.
- Bradford was an attorney by profession and was involved in the shipping business.
- He later became one of the leaders of the Whiskey Rebellion in 1794.



We proudly tell the story of the Whiskey Rebellion and the role Bradford played in this first test of the powers of the Constitution of the United States.

Why volunteer?

Requirements:


- All volunteers must complete any training required for the position.

- The Whiskey Rebellion Festival is held the second weekend in July.
- Other events are scheduled throughout the year.
